Begin the service at 11am by firmly ringing the chime behind the podium; this allows everyone to find their seats. Wait for the room to settle before beginning to speak. If you have difficulty managing the microphone, please contact Rev Chris Buice or David Asbury for assistance before or after a service.

If you need any accessibility aids during the service, such as a large print hymnal, hearing device, or noise canceling headphones– those can be found on a cart near the welcome table in the lobby. Our ushers will be glad to show you the way or collect one for you if needed.

If you are visiting us with small children, we invite you to sit up front where it is easier for your little ones to see what is going on. Please don't feel that you must keep them still... all are welcome here, and we understand that silence is never completely silent.

You should also feel free to change seats at any time during the service if you need to move closer or even just stretch your legs. If you or your children need to step out of the sanctuary for a moment, the EE Cummings Room is a glass enclosed room at the back of the sanctuary where you can still see and hear the service. *Indicate the EE Cummings Room*
